32	Background - paragraph 5	Delete: “...no wild reindeer and only Sami people have the right to own reindeer.” Replace with: “...no wild reindeer and only Sami people have the rights of reindeer husbandry.”
	Background - paragraph 5	Delete: “The farmed cervid species in Sweden are red deer and mule deer.” Replace with: “The farmed cervid species in Sweden are mainly fallow deer and red deer, as well as a small number of moose”
81	Results - Food	Delete: “...food enterprises showed that 1,284 samples for <i>Salmonella</i> were taken for reasons other than the <i>Salmonella</i> control programme. Nine of these 1,284 samples were positive. Seven of these nine were spices, one was a pastry bag used for piping mashed potatoes and one was granulated onion.” Replace with: “enterprises showed that 741 samples for <i>Salmonella</i> were taken for reasons other than the <i>Salmonella</i> control programmes. Six of these 741 samples were positive. Five of these were meat products from either pig, bovine animals or unspecified and one was from raw meat from broilers.”
