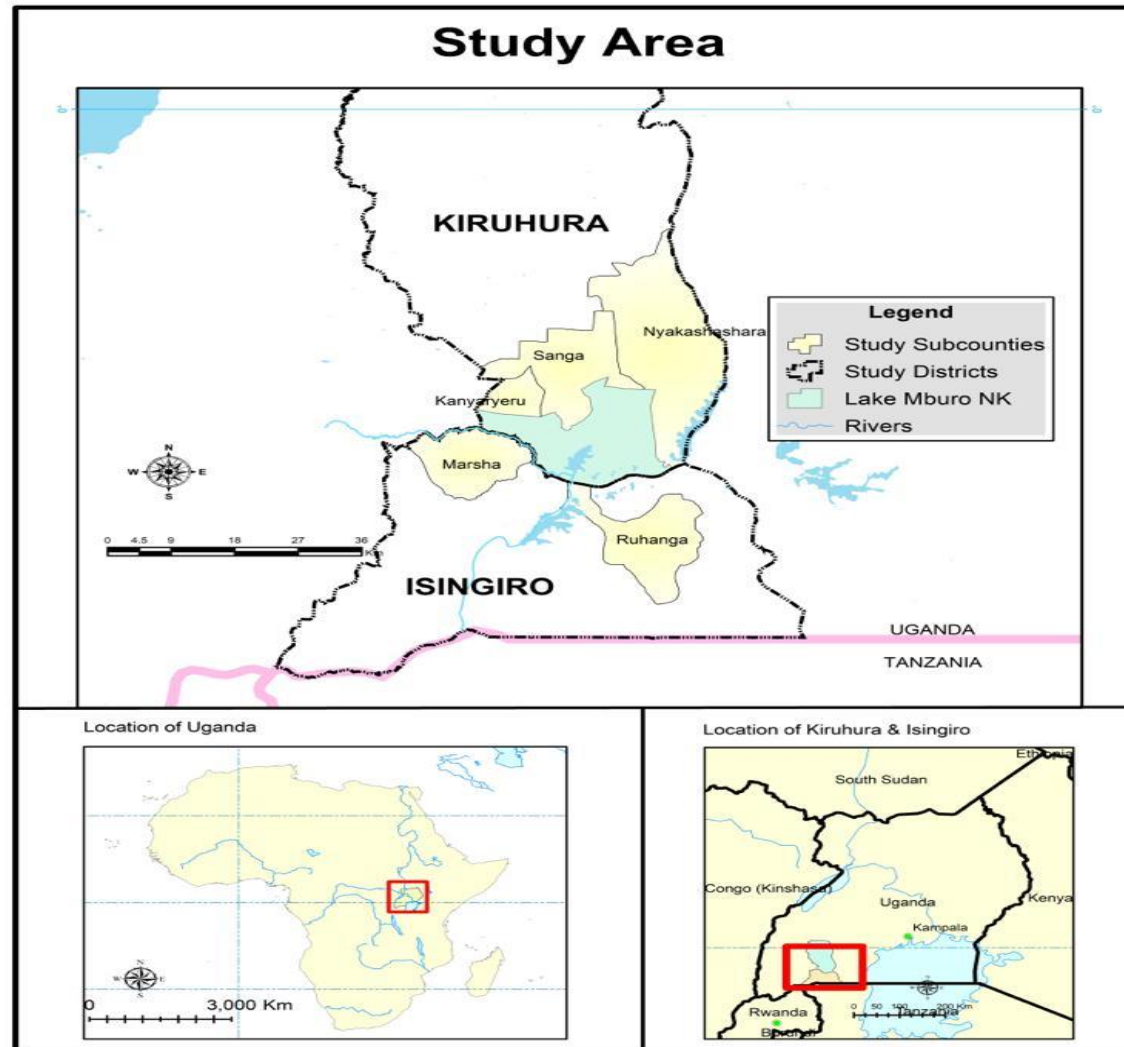

# Objectives

- To obtain information and Document the milk safety practices practiced during production, handling and marketing of milk of livestock origin
